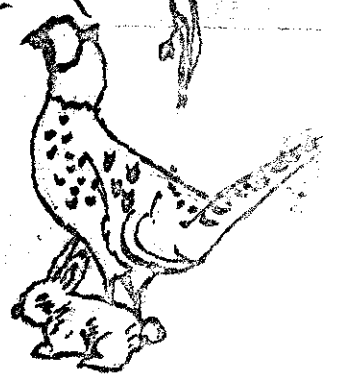

SHIRE HALL TITBITS

At the request of the Cambridgeshire Association of Local Councils, the problem of encroachment by farmers and others on to highway verges and soft roads was discussed at a recent meeting at Shire Hall. Regular get-togethers involving County Councillors and Parish Council representatives now take place, and quite a number of shared worries can be ironed out in this way, but highway boundaries have proved to be the most difficult yet.

We decided that the issue should be given prominence at the County's Policy Committee Meeting, and this was done with quite good Press coverage as a consequence. We also decided that the matter should be brought to the attention of the National Farmers Union, and a meeting is going to take place just before the publication of Out of Reach. It was also suggested that Parish Councils could advise the County Surveyor of stretches of road potentially dangerous as a result of encroachment, and that Parish Councils should try to persuade farmers and others to give notice of any intention to fill in ditches so that the edge of the highway could be marked, and that all should be encouraged to refrain from removing boundary posts.

The problem is alleged to exist mainly in the North and East of the County, and I am sure that few, if any, examples exist in our patch and, even if they do, they are more likely to be ancient crimes than recent. My own view, however, is that proper legalities should be observed by all, and if anyone in Reach parish has a complaint on this matter, I will gladly take it up with the appropriate organisations.

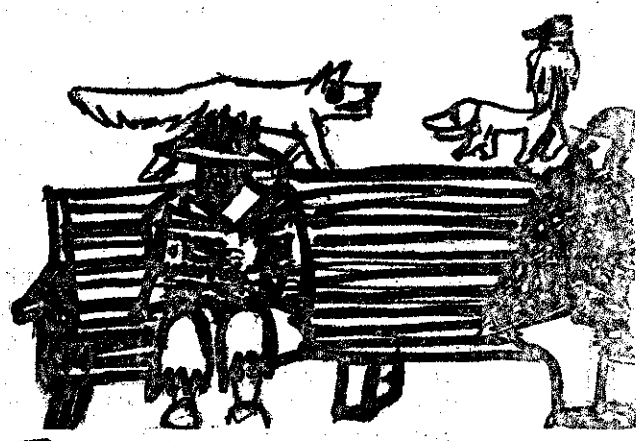
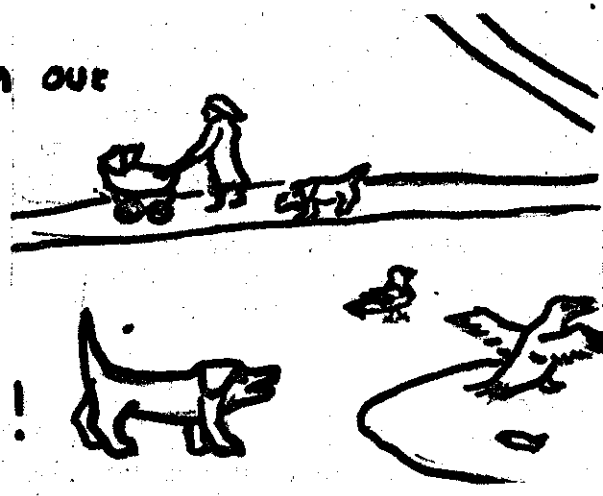
1. One day Dyke's dad bought him a chicken. Dyke made a hen house for it.



2. Fen would like to chase it as he did the rabbits on the dyke.

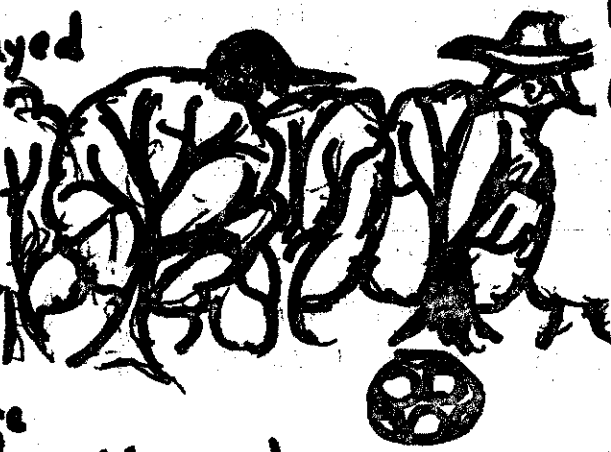


3. Or, when out for a walk, the ducks and pigeons!

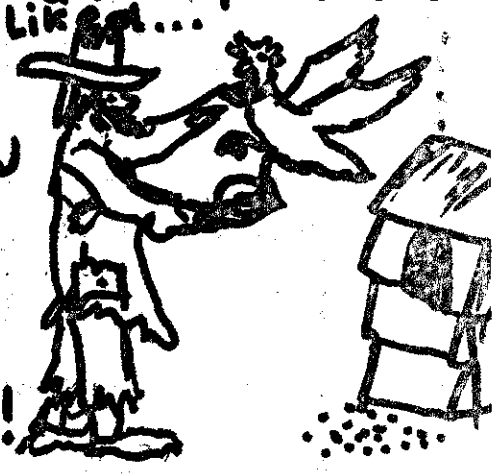


4. They often met up with "Prince" - the big dog from next door and sometimes noticed a tramp whom nobody liked...

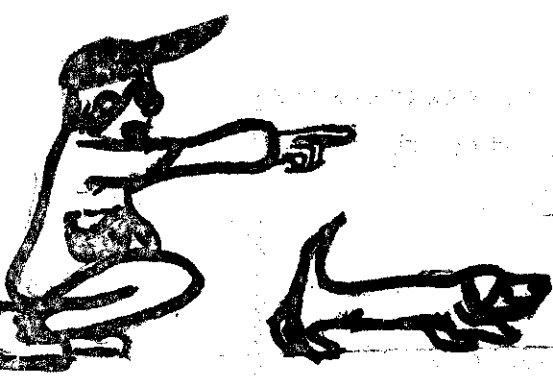
5. Once Dyke played football with the boy next door... the ball went over the hedge and when they looked over the hedge....



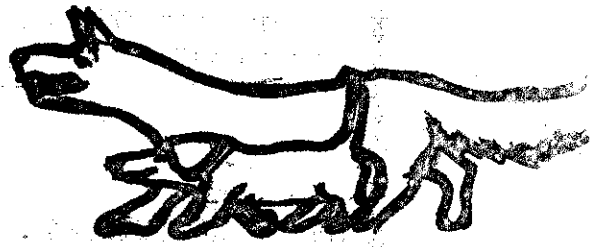

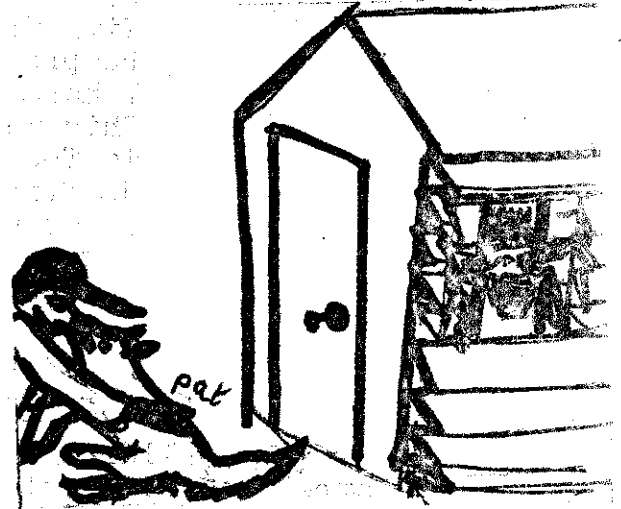
Dyk told Fen to fetch Prince

RECIPE

RASPBERRY MOUSSE

- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. gelatine
- 1 lb. fresh raspberries (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. frozen)
- $\frac{1}{2}$  pt. double cream
- 4 tbsp. castor sugar
- 4 eggs
- $\frac{1}{4}$  lb. macaroons

Dissolve gelatine in 2 tbsps. warm water.  
 Puree the fruit.  
 Whisk cream, sugar and egg yolks together. Cook over just simmering water, still whisking until thick and smooth. Stir in dissolved gelatine and fruit puree. Allow to cool, stirring occasionally.  
 Whip egg whites until stiff and fold into mixture.  
 Cover and refridgerate until almost set.  
 Crush macaroons and fold into mixture.  
 Chill until completely set.
